#### Mission

Improve soil health on Kosciusko's urban and community small-scale agricultural land (10 acres or under). Provide soil sampling, technical assistance, host workshops, and establish educational materials. Target: community gardens, home gardens, school gardens, church gardens, hospital /governmental gardens, or any other specialty growing operation.

#### **4 Soil Health Principles**

- 1. Minimize Disturbance

  Disturb the soil as little as possible.
- 2. Maximize Soil Cover Keep the soil covered as much as possible.
- 3. Maximize Biodiversity

  Using crop rotation and cover crops.
- 4. Maximize Continuous Living Roots Keep plants growing throughout the year.

Conservation Practices: Low-till / permanent beds, Mulching, Cover crops, Crop rotation, Compost / organic matter, Nutrient management, Native + targeted plantings for beneficial insects + pollinators, High
